

## Attorney Visiting Information FAX Sheet

If you are an attorney or an attorney representative and wish to schedule a visit for an inmate housed at Pelican Bay State Prison please send the following information to our visiting office via fax to:

The information shall be in writing and signed by the attorney and/or judge, and shall contain the following for each attorney or attorney representative(s):

1. Names and Title
2. Drivers License Number
3. Social Security Number (optional)
4. Date of Birth
5. State Bar Number / Professional License Number
6. The Name and CDC number of the inmate you wish to visit
7. Address and Contact information
8. List any prior criminal history

Also provide a declaration from the sponsoring attorney that you are providing legal assistance to the inmate you wish to see. You must have the security clearance form and primary laws, rules, and regulations (CDCR 181) on file annually and/or if there are any changes to your personal information needed to obtain clearance.

Please note that all professional licenses must be current and in good standing to obtain a legal visit with an inmate housed in any California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility.

If you are bringing or sending attorney representative(s) remember you are allowed two persons per inmate to include the attorney.

Per California Codes of Regulations Title 15 section 3178: an attorney representative must be one of the following:

- (A) Private investigator licensed by any state and sponsored by the attorney or appointed by the court.
- (B) An investigator who is employed by a government agency, public agency or public institution.
- (C) A law student sponsored by the attorney.
- (D) A legal Para-professional sponsored by the attorney or appointed by the court.
- (E) An employee of an attorney, legitimate legal service organization, or licensed private investigator that is sponsored by the attorney or licensed private investigator.
- (F) Personnel retained by an attorney or attorney representative, including, but not limited to certified sign language interpreters, certified language interpreters and court reporters may accompany the attorney or attorney representative during the private consultation and are required to provide the information requested above. Licensed mental or medical health care professionals may also serve as attorney representatives and do not have to be accompanied by the attorney.

- All information will be subject to a California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System background check prior to scheduling a visit -

### Time Lines:

For new attorneys or attorney representative(s) please provide five working days to process your request. Returning attorneys or attorney representative(s) please allow at least two working days for processing. After your background is cleared you will be contacted by visiting staff to set up an appointment to meet with the inmate. Please do not send fax's to the office on Saturday or Sunday as the office is used for regular visitor processing during these days. Please be sure to call and confirm that your information was received.

### Hours of Operation:

Attorney visiting hours are Tuesday and Wednesday from 0730-1330. Saturday and Sunday during the inmates available appointment time.

### Dress Code:

**DISALLOWED CLOTHING** includes: any blue or chambray, gray sweats, green jumpsuit, tan top with green bottom combination and camouflage. You will be required to clear a metal detector, please plan accordingly. If you require a medical device or have a medical implant and cannot clear a metal detector please bring a doctors note stating so and you will be cleared via a hand held metal detector. If you are sending attorney representative(s) please be sure they are dressed appropriately for the visit. Please leave any electrical or electronic devices (ie-cellphone, pad, laptop etc...) in your vehicle or at home. PBSP will supply a recording device, but you must bring sealed tapes for the device.

### Conduct:

You must abide by all penal codes while on State Prison Property

CONDUCT AND ASSOCIATION WITH STATE PRISON INMATES  
CDC 181 (Rev 5/98)

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

Individuals who are not employees of the California Department of Corrections (CDC), but who are working in and around inmates who are incarcerated within California's institutions/facilities or camps, are to be apprised of the laws, rules and regulations governing conduct in associating with prison inmates. The following is a summation of pertinent information when non-departmental employees come in contact with prison inmate.

1. Persons who are not employed by CDC, but are engaged in work at any institution/facility or camp must observe and abide by all laws, rules and regulations governing the conduct of their behavior in associating with prison inmates. Failure to comply with these guidelines may lead to expulsion from CDC institutions/facilities or camps.

2. CDC does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CDC has a "NO HOSTAGE" policy and all prison inmates, visitors, and employees shall be made aware of this.

3. All persons entering onto institution/facility or camp grounds consent to a search of their person, property or vehicle at any time. Refusal by individuals to submit to a search of their person, property or vehicle may be cause for denial of access to the premises.

4. Persons normally permitted to enter an institution/facility or camp may be barred, for cause, by the CDC Director, Warden and/or Regional Parole Administrator.

5. It is illegal for an individual who has been previously convicted of a felony offense to enter into CDC institutions/facilities or camps without the prior approval of the Warden. It is also illegal for an individual to enter onto these premises for unauthorized purposes or to refuse to leave said premises when requested to do so. Failure to comply with this provision could lead to prosecution.

6. Encouraging and/or assisting prison inmates to escape is a crime. It is illegal to bring firearms, deadly weapons, explosives, tear gas, drugs or drug paraphernalia on CDC institution/facilities or camp premises. It is illegal to give prison inmates firearms, explosives, alcoholic beverages, narcotics, or any drug or drug paraphernalia, including cocaine or marijuana.

7. It is illegal to give or take letters from prison inmates without the authorization of the Warden. It is also illegal to give or receive any type of gift and/or gratuities from prison inmates.

8. In an emergency situation the visiting program and other program activities may be suspended.

9. For security reasons, visitors must not wear clothing that in any way resembles state issued prison inmate clothing (blue denim shirts, blue denim pants).

10. Interviews with SPECIFIC INMATES are not permitted. Conspiring with an inmate to circumvent policy and/or regulations constitutes a rule violation that may result in appropriate legal action.
