Dear Ms. Henry:

This is in response to the above referenced Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for records in several categories concerning the Federal Prison Camp in Dublin, California (FCI Dublin).

In response to a portion of Item 11 of your request wherein you seek records concerning property claims, staff located 326 pages of responsive records, which were forwarded to this office for a release determination. After careful review, 26 pages are appropriate for release in full, 297 pages are appropriate for release in part, and 3 pages are non-responsive. In response to a portion of Items 1, 8, and 22, staff located 674 pages of emails, which were forwarded to this office for a release determination. After careful review, 2 pages are appropriate for release in full, 41 pages are appropriate for release in part, 11 pages must be withheld in their entirety, 28 pages are entirely duplicative, and 592 pages are non-responsive. Copies of the non-duplicative, releasable records are attached.

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, records were redacted under the following exemptions:

- (b)(5) - permits withholding of records concerning certain inter- and intra-agency communications protected by the deliberative process privilege, the attorney work-product privilege, and/or the attorney-client privilege,
- (b)(6) - concerns material the release of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties, and
- (b)(7)(C) - concerns records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes the release of which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.

The BOP considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing responsive records and applying FOIA exemptions.
