CHAPTER: Transportation	SUBJECT: Transporting Juveniles

- I. **PURPOSE:** To define transportation responsibilities for juveniles housed in juvenile hall or in adult detention facilities.
- II. **POLICY:** Transportation's responsibility for transporting juveniles shall be limited to procedures described herein.
- III. **PROCEDURE:**
 - A. Persons in custody at Juvenile Hall, charged as a juvenile:
 1. Under 18 years of age will be transported by Juvenile Probation.
 2. Over 18 years in age will be delivered to the Sheriff unless the court orders continued detention in Juvenile Hall. The Agency will transport only if the defendant has been remanded into custody of the Sheriff, regardless of housing location.
 - B. Juveniles charged as an adult and remanded to custody of the Sheriff regardless of holding facility, will be transported by Sheriff's Transportation.
 - C. Juveniles shall not be transported in the same vehicle with adult prisoners, nor shall they be transported with prisoners of the opposite sex except under extraordinary circumstances and then with the permission of a supervisor. This is in compliance with 208 (a) W&I and CALEA standards, which mandates adults and juveniles be separated from each other by sight and sound. Examples of extraordinary circumstances are as follows:
 1. When a compartmentalized vehicle is unavailable and actual or potential interference from bystanders requires the immediate removal of the prisoners from an emergency scene.
 2. An evacuation, riot, or other disturbance requires prompt transportation of large numbers of prisoners.
 3. When extreme emergencies or priorities prevent dispatching of more than one transporting vehicle.
